

Certificate II in Community Health and Wellbeing (Pre-traineeship)

The Community Health and Wellbeing pre-traineeship is an opportunity for Year 11 and 12 secondary school students to start exploring their career in the health and community services sectors whilst studying at school. The pre-traineeship offers nine units of competence in total, six core units and three elective units from either the Allied Health or Aboriginal Health pathways. Meaningful work experience (110 hours) with local organisations forms an essential part of the pre-traineeship, supporting students to make an informed decision about their career while gaining valuable hands-on experience in local workplaces. Upon successful completion students can progress to further studies in the health and community services sector, continue into a related traineeship or secure employment in the rewarding and growing health and community services industry. Training and Assessment Delivery

- Practical work-based tasks (these involve demonstration and practice activities in a simulated work environment)
- Online and face to face training (including theory, multi-media learning and group work)
