- Determine and implement disease prevention and control measures
- Provide information and support on environmental health issues
- Provide a first aid response to a casualty

UNITS OF COMPETENCY

HLTPOP030 Determine and implement disease prevention and control measures

This unit introduces the essential skills to identify community diseases, understand how they spread, and apply control measures following set guidelines. It is intended for supervised public health workers, and no licensing or regulatory requirements currently apply.

HLTAID011 Provide First Aid

This unit outlines the essential skills to provide first aid in line with Australian Resuscitation Council guidelines. It applies to anyone who may need to respond to first aid situations. Licensing or refresher requirements should be checked with the relevant WHS authority.

HLTPOP031 Provide information and support on environmental health issues

This unit focuses on providing guidance to communities and households about environmental health concerns. It is for supervised public health workers following set procedures, and it has no current licensing or legislative requirements.
