



Certificate II in Community Health and Wellbeing

The Certificate II in Community Health and Wellbeing introduces students to careers in the health and community services sectors. The qualification offers nine units of competence in total, six core units and three elective units from either the Allied Health or Aboriginal Health pathways. Students also complete meaningful work experience with local organisations, helping them explore career options and gain practical skills. Graduates can progress to further study, traineeships, or entry-level roles in the growing health and community services industry.
